#### Winter Notes - It's not over yet!

Parking & Snow removal: Reminder no parking during a snow event or parking more than 24 hours from November through April. If you know it is going to snow, move your vehicle off the street. If you see the plows out and you are parked on the street - move your vehicle to a plowed area. The city will do a final cleanup after an event. Some events are continuous due to drifting or continued snow. The city could have a vehicle towed, if not moved. Per State Statute 169.42 you cannot plow, dump, blow, or shovel snow into any roadway.

125th Community Quilt:

Thank you to everyone who sewed a quilt square! The sewing group will be working on sewing boarders on each block and then completing the quilt in the next months. If you have not returned your quilt block (s) drop them at the city office during office hours, or take them to the community center during a sewing group day on the first Saturday each month and March 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Council Briefs: 1/13/2025

**Oath of Office**: Tauber Mayor, Hartley & VanDeest council members at large.

**Approved**: Agenda and Consent Agenda including the 12/9 minutes & bills totaling \$442,780.72 the treasurer's report including the bank reconciliation for December, receipts of \$371,736.56, 2024 payrolls 25, 26, EOY PTO payout over 80 hours and 2025 Payroll 1.

**Reports:** Fox: Submitted report & updates. P&R hockey day 1/26. Request for a can drop at the WWTF, council denied the request.

Tauber: Attended a Zoom meeting with Fox & Senator Frentz Burger: Submitted report and highlighted gWorks pushed back to January 20th. Garbage and Xcel rate changes. No update on the revolving loan funds, working on EOY & Audit prep. Uhde: EMT refresher had 11 members attending. Working to get them all on the same cycle to be able to hold in-house refreshers. Steak Fry February 8, two of the Allina trained are now members, one more Allina trainee is retaking the test and the last one decided not to pursue. Peterson: Attended the ambulance commission meeting. Raised the per household from \$40 to \$45, and the VP from \$350 to \$500. Klingler: Polar Plunge is February 1, the rural farm board meeting February 12. Upcoming events: P&R to hold a meat bingo and Fog youth a ham bingo. Reed: Attended the final Nicollet County Community Assessment – focused on mental health in the county. There will be individual meetings in Lafayette, Nicollet and Courtland. Polich: will be attending leadership training.

**Unfinished Business: RO:** Fox & Tauber met with Senator Frentz to discussed the RO project bonding. **Stormwater**: Reviewed modeling and have three scenarios. EPA & DELTA met 1/10 to discuss findings and funding options. **STREAMS**: Fox feels the technical team has come up with a suitable rate schedule. STREAMS was invited to a DNR round table to present the project. **MPCA** 

**Permit:** On hold. Ord. 150 Xcel franchise ordinance and CUP Application public hearings rescheduled for the February meetings. **New Business:** Approved: Resolutions for 2025 Civic duties,
