- 3) Lafayette is a pet friendly city. As more residents are out walking dogs will bark. Remember to keep your neighbors happy and try to limit the barking time. (PS: be sure to register your dogs and cats, if you have not!)
- 4) As the weather warms and we get out and about more, remember to be a good neighbor. Meet your neighbors! Maybe they have health issues or dealing with children, elderly parents, etc. the list is endless of what may be going on. Being a good neighbor offer help!

Council Briefs: 4/8/2024 6:30pm

There were no appeals for the Local Board of Appeals and Equalization hearing. Approved the consent agenda: Including, 3/11 minutes & 3/19 MPCA recap, bills totaling \$52,726.75, and treasurer's report, receipts totaling \$32,987.03, payrolls 6 & 7.

Guests: Shana Jackson & Erin Wachtel - Nicollet County Assessor's office, Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications, Laura Hacker - resident.

Reports: Fox: May 1 delivery of the new playground equipment. (since postponed due to weather) UV tank was installed and will be operational by May 1, sampling due this month, council approved replacing the last two doors to the fire hall

Burger: permits approved – P&R shed and removal of a deck to build a 3-season porch. Created a tri-county & city collection flyer to go in the newsletter, highlighted the 125th committee recap.

Klingler: New fire truck delivered, council asked Fox & Klingler to look into the feasibility for the city to pay a stipend to rural fire and use this as the city pumper.

Unfinished Business: Highlighted the progress of the state bonding, EPA grant and PFA application. WWTF permit limits imposed by the MPCA and what options for compliance. He asked for a 30-day extension and set up a second meeting is set up for 4/29/24 at 1pm to discuss.

New Business: Approved Resolution 2024-07, April Donations, electronic donations & tips from the steak fry for the Ambulance of \$1,000.00 & Fillmeup to Celebration fund \$40. Approved the first reading of Ord 147; removing the words" gardening and landscaping" from description of accessory use. Approved the 2024 ambulance officers: President: Dick, Vice-president: Uhde, Secretary: Griebel, Data reporting & Active 911: Beranek, Maintenance and supplies: C Goblirsch, Training: R Helling- Goblirsch, Infectious control: Gieseke.

The next council meeting will be held on Mayl, 13, 2024at 7pm. This is just a glimpse of the council meeting. Full minutes are posted on the city website once they are approved at the following council regular

STREAMS update: Lafayette along with Winthrop, Gibbon and New Auburn are exploring a regional wastewater and water reuse facility, in part due to the stringent MNPCA permit limits on our current permit and future limits that are in the works. Small cities are unable to rebuild facilities individually to meet these standards and working together would hopefully eliminate that issue. Another part of it is the lack of ground water for the industries in the area, the reuse part of this would be to utilize the wastewater and treat it to be usable water for these types of industries. Council members and staff from each community will meet monthly via TEAMS to stay updated on the progress. Currently we are looking at the industries to sign letters of intent, so the preliminary engineering can be done. Once that is done the next step to look into funding (similar to what we are doing for the RO addition to the water plant) for the feasibility of the project. The next meeting via TEAMS will be held on Wednesday, May 8.
