Council Briefs: 6/10/2024 7:00pm

Guests: Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications

Approved the Consent Agenda including 5/13 minutes, bills totaling \$78,426.02, treasurer's report: May bank reconciliation, receipts \$37,387.47, payrolls 10 & 11 and council's first half pay.

Reports: Fox: Playground delivered today, weather permitting should be done by Friday. Due to drainage issues, council approved a spillway from the northeast corner and to connect with the current spillway. Testing results received are all good, waiting on the Lead and Copper, alarms at the WWTF due to a power issue and storm event for high influent. **Burger:** In addition to her submitted report, she shared that the State Legislature passed an exemption for Fire and Ambulance volunteers from ESST. Southern Minnesota Initiative Foundation (SMIF) will highlight our bandstand project in an upcoming bog. Updated the council on the adjusted 2024 small cities funding from the state. Discussed the COVID payment plans Council approved a motion to end the COVID payment plans and directed her to mail letters to the two accounts, the 125th committee will meet on June 17. **Polich:** Attended the STREAMS via video. **Peterson:** A few complaints of people not mowing.

Unfinished Business: RO: State bonding did not pass, EPA historical review, PFA application was accepted, being there was not bonding bill he will apply for the Point Source Implementation Grant (PSIG) by the July 31st deadline. WWTF Permit: Final review submittal was sent on May 29, 2024. MPCA Storm water Grant: Only a handful of properties to review, SEH is working on cleaning and televising bid packet and contract for the project. EPA was contacted and explained what we wish to accomplish for WWTF reductions and storm sewer. They will be able to help with funding & grant opportunities when the time comes. STREAMS: A virtual meeting to discuss a proposal from Flattery-Hood for services in the start-up and guidance of the Sanitary Sewer District. Looft will present a resolution to Winthrop city council for authorization to pay for services until a board is completed. The next meeting will be both virtual and in person in Winthrop on Tuesday, July 2, to discuss tentative rates and to meet the industrial partners. Ord. 147 council approved and adopted the word update on ordinance 147, which is posted on the website and published in Winthrop paper.

New Business: Approved **Resolution 2024-09 June donations**, \$545.86 from relief for half of the fire/ambulance bench. Donations totaling \$1,350 to the 125th: Durheim \$50, L Mages \$250, Mages Land \$250, \$200 Tauber Plumbing & Heating, \$500 Isenberg Electric, & \$100 from Rusch and cups and bowls donated by Donnay for the community center. Approved the 1st reading of Ord 148 updating code 33.04 Reimbursement of computer and computer related equipment - it is posted on the website. Liability policy update, Polich reported it is working on a few more items before they present to council. Relief Liquor License was approved for the July 26th event, Blight properties were discussed and letters sent to ten properties. One was a city right-of-way and the city will trim it.

The next council meeting will be held on July 8, 2024 at 7pm. This is just a glimpse of the council meeting. Full minutes are posted on the city website once they are approved at the following council regular meeting.
