2024 Election: 2024 Primary Election Day is Tuesday, August 13 – mail ballots must be received to the county by that date.

Two council at large (Portner and Tauber) & the mayor (Peterson) positions up for reelection this year. Affidavits of Candidacy will be available & received during the filling period which runs from Tuesday, July 30, 2024 until Tuesday, August 13 during regular business hours of 7 am to noon and 1 to 4pm and will be posted to the Secretary of States website. See the Election Notice on the door for the details or check out the Secretary of State's website for all election info.

As a mail-in precinct - registered voters were mailed ballot packets recently. To vote in person you will need to take your ballot packet to the county, or if not registered, you can do so by going to the Nicollet County Public Services department, temporarily located at 622 S. Front Street, St. Peter.

Council Briefs: 7/12/2024 7:00pm

Guests: Nicollet County Sheriff – Dave Lange, Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications, Attorney Jim Kuettner and Glenn Hauser – Integrity Farms, Residents – Dave Burger 580 Main Avenue, Marty Wacker 540 Main Avenue and Stuart Hartley 1120 Esther Avenue.

Approved the Consent Agenda including the 6/10 and 7/1 council minutes, bills totaling \$123,018.71, the treasurer's report including the bank reconciliation for June, receipts totaling \$214,28.98, 2024 payrolls 12 & 13.

Guests: Attorney Jim Kuettner and Glenn Hauser were on hand to inform the council of their intent for the empty school building. They will submit an application for a state license to create an indoor, secure, cannabis cultivation facility – there would be no sales, only growing. The playground equipment was offered to the city, but was declined. The consensus of the council was that the city could find a place in Lund park for the exercise stations. (The memory garden and little library can stay on the property.)

Reports: Fox: Updated that park is too muddy for completion of the playground. Other things being worked on: steps and rail to bandstand, install benches and street sweeping and spraying started. The last Lead & Copper samplings were within the compliance thresholds, next round in September, if they are also good, we will be on a three-years cycle. Burger: In addition to her submitted report, she shared election information, LMC regional training on Artificial Intelligence, the Ditch 40A redetermination -the city share is over \$14,000. Peterson: Food trucks are doing well, 125th committee met. Klingler: Raffle and Craft Beer tasting coming up, one new application, recruitment flyers posted. Dick: Four new members wrapping up their training. Ambulance is working with Nicollet and Sibley Counties, Gaylord and Winthrop ambulance to link their systems together to help with daytime calls.

Unfinished Business: Fox updated council on the progress of all the projects. RO: the EPA is reviewing the packet for any further submittals that may be required, the PSIG grant application needs a resolution and final engineer review to be submitted ahead of schedule. Council approved a resolution authorizing the City to submit the Point Source Implementation Grant to the MN PUC and authorize city officials to execute the grant agreement on the city behalf.

STREAMS: Fox gave a brief recap of the July 2 meeting. The next meeting will be July 18, 2024 at 9:00 am. Ord 148: updated wording on code 33.04 Reimbursement of computer and computer related equipment - it is posted on the website and tabled until August. Blight properties progress made; follow-up letters sent to encourage continued work. Liability policy update, Polich reported it is working on a few more items before they present to council.

New Business: Approved the July donations of \$13,277.00, which included \$13,000 from the Lions and \$25 from Kolbinger for the new playground, Donations of \$252.00 to the 125th celebrations as follows \$200 from Winthrop News, \$52 from the FillMeUp bucket. Also approved a payment plan, the ESST policy update exempting the volunteer fire and ambulance from the program, and rolling over the entire amount of the CD when it matures in August to another 15-month CD.

The next council meeting will be held on Monday, August 12, 2024 at 7pm and the first budget workshop on Monday, August 19 at 7pm. This is just a glimpse of the council meeting. Full minutes are posted on the city website once they are approved at the following council regular meeting.
