* If you vote early and change your mind, the timeline to 'claw back a ballot' is 18 days before the election or Friday, October 18, 2024. (when this happens the originally submitted ballot is voided and a new ballot is issued.)

You can mail your ballot or drop your ballot in person at the courthouse anytime from September 20th to November 5th at 8pm, when all polls close.

Council Briefs: 8/12/2024 7:00pm

Approved: Consent Agenda including the 7/8 minutes, bills totaling \$133,463.21, the treasurer's report including the bank reconciliation for

June, receipts of \$130,315.90, 2024 payrolls 14, 15 & 16

Reports: Fox: Submitted report & updates: spillway in the park will be done in September, council approved replacing the hydrant at the rink \$4800 and a laptop for Moldan for \$1300 Burger: In addition to her report, shared her & Dick applied for the state funding for the ambulance. The state set up \$24,000,000 to help out small rural ambulance services in the state, two ambulance trainees passed testing and will begin ride-alongs, two more working on testing. Peterson: The park is being used a lot; shared a League of MN Cities letter sent to Frentz honoring his work for our area. Klingler: Concrete poured by the bell, relief will reimburse, one application in, two maybes. Reed: Lions are applying to NU Foundation for a grant to the playground.

Unfinished Business: Fox updated council on the progress of all the projects and funding. No word from MPCA for WWTF permit. Stormwater grant - RFP sent to five contractors for cleaning and televising lines, Lead inventory completed and sent to MDH; 283 connections, 2 are galvanized and need replacement and 26 unknown (it will be updated and submit later) STREAMS: Next meeting 8/22, Kimley-Horn to have feasibility completed by October meeting. Ord 148: council approved the updated wording on code 33.04 Reimbursement of Computer and Computer related equipment. Blight properties: Two properties have issues — Burger will work with city attorney for notice of destruction orders. Liability policy update, Polich, Reed & Klingler presented the updates to the Personnel Policy Chapter 17 Drug-Free workplace, council approved the update as amended.

New Business: Approved the July donations of \$1,095, which included \$654 from Friends of 125th Hotdish cook off, \$200 Citizens Bank, \$150 Charlie & Sandy Hartley, \$91 Fillmeup Bucket all to the 125th celebrations. Also approved a payment plan, Fire SOGs updates, gWorks agreement, and DSI request to extend the Solar CUP through 9/2025. Council also set a public hearing to certify a delinquent utility bill to the tax rolls. The next council meeting will be held on Monday, September 9, 2024 at 7pm. *This is just a glimpse of the council meeting. Full minutes are posted on the city website once they are approved at the following council regular meeting.*

2025 City Budget:

The first budget workshop was on Monday, August 19 at 7pm. These past months the staff have been working on the 2025 budget. The council does listen to requests and evaluates the best way to spend the city funds. Wish lists have been noted and included in the first draft. The council and staff met on Monday, August 19 to discuss and make adjustments to the budget. At the September meeting the council will approve the Preliminary 2025 Budget and submit it to the County. The preliminary budget will always be higher, due to many unknown projections and will be reviewed when more firm numbers of things like insurance, healthcare, etc. The second budget workshop will be in December prior to the approval of the final budget at the December meeting.
