**Sunday:** Prayer Service in Memorial park, Dad's Belgium waffles – fire hall, possible kid's pedal pull, parade and possible NU Battery for a grand finale shooting the cannons at Lund park. We will need a lot of volunteers!

## Council Briefs: 9/9/2024 7:00pm

**Guests:** Doug Hanson – Winthrop News, Resident Jessica Tauber, Dean Sabacky -REMAX, and John Upton.

Public hearing - certify delinquent utilities, no comments at the meeting or to the clerk prior to the meeting.

**Approved**: Agenda as amended by removing the Fire SOG update. Consent Agenda including the 8/12 minutes & 8/19 Budget workshop recap, bills totaling \$44,112.58, the treasurer's report including the bank reconciliation for August, receipts of \$49,552.92, 2024 payrolls 17 & 18. Reports: Fox: Submitted report & updates: spillway in the park will be done in September, council approved a quote of \$9,695 to update the driveway to the ball parks, remove and replace the gravel by the community center pavilion and maintenance work to the gravel park access road running parallel to 9th street. Burger: In addition to her report, updated council on the Post Office, gWorks onboarding, mentioned the November council date was changed to Tuesday, due to the Veteran's holiday – this now falls on the Lions 45th celebration and suggested the council meeting be moved to Wednesday November 13 council approved the change of date. Peterson: Shared an invitation to send off troops - no council was able to attend, Mentioned Burger has been with the City for 10 years. Polich: attended RS Fiber meeting Unfinished Business: Fox updated council on the progress of all the projects and funding. No word from MPCA for WWTF permit. Stormwater grant: EPA sent a Delta Institute memo – next step will be a MOU that sets options for what may need to be done. STREAMS: Council approved the Memorandum of Understanding and authorizing planning related to the establishment of a regional wastewater treatment facility. They are holding technical meetings every Wednesday. Blight properties: Burger updated council that letters were sent and received and proper time has passed. The tree and vehicle items were taken care of before the council meeting, but not the mowing/weeds. Council approved Fox to have our mowing contractor cleanup the two properties.

New Business: Approved September donations of \$351, which included \$51 Fillmeup Bucket to the 125th celebration and \$300 from the 4-H for the use of the fire hall. Approved Resolution 2024-15 to certify a delinguent utility bill to the tax rolls Polich shared an update to RS Fiber looking to sell to HBC. The JPB will meet on September 25th to review a legal review of the letter of intent by HBC. Approved to renew healthcare with PEIP, approved the hiring of firefighters, Elias Webster, Brian Longtin and Cole Gostonczik pending passing of interviews, physicals and State firefighter background checks. Tabled the Excavating snow removal agreement until October. Approved a request from Polz to be able to sell the church property and put one and a half times the final quote into an escrow account for the utility work that needed to be done prior to selling the property. Approved the 2025 preliminary budget and Levy with an increase of \$30,942, which included projects for the 125<sup>th</sup> and possible insurance and other increases not know yet. The final budget will be approved at the December 9th council meeting.

The next council meeting will be held on Monday, October 14, 2024 at 7pm. This is just a glimpse of the council meeting. Full minutes are posted on the city website once they are approved at the following council regular meeting. All council meetings are open to the public.
