## As the year winds down, the Holidays are in full swing!!

**12/10 – Santa Day is finally here!** Join them at the Community Center from 4:30 to 6:30pm. The kids will enjoy visiting Santa, activities and treats and will be followed by Mayor Peterson lighting the holiday tree in the Memorial Park!

#### <u>Annual Pet Licenses:</u>

Included in your billing are applications to renew your pet's license. If you have added or lost a cat or dog this past year, please let me know. ALL Cats and Dogs need to be licensed. The licenses run January 1- December 31st EVERY year and they need to be renewed EVERY year and vaccination records need to be current. Council has set the fee schedule to only \$2 per pet - from December 1 through January 31 each year. Renew now and if you have an upcoming vet appointment just make note of the date on your application and then drop off your vaccination record after the appointment - or have them fax it 507-543-7083 or email it to me directly <a href="mailto:lafcityclerk@gmail.com">lafcityclerk@gmail.com</a>.

#### gWorks:

We have rescheduled the switchover until the beginning of January so we can complete 2024 with UBMax. One BIG change will be with ACH payments. I will no longer be able to post a mass ACH draft for accounts as I do now. If you want to still do ACH payments, you will need to create a user in their Front Office and enter all of your information there. You will also be able to just post online payments. Once we are ready to "go live" with gWorks we will alert you of the information and link. More details to come when I know we will be "live" on the program.

All payments due on December 25<sup>th</sup> even though it's a holiday, ACH accounts will still be drafted on December 20<sup>th</sup>, as we are still on UBMax, but moving into January, that will not be an option. There will be a small user fee attached based on the size of the bill. I will NOT be posting draft payments for bills due on January 25<sup>th</sup>. You will need to pay them or — hopefully we are running with gWorks and you will be able to sign up in Front Desk.

## 125<sup>th</sup> Community Quilt:

You will see in your packet a half-paged flyer from the Weekend Quilters. They have quilt square kits available for residents to sew. This is a community quilt which will be raffled off during the 125<sup>th</sup> celebration next summer. Go to our city Facebook page to see a photo of the quilt pattern and sample kits. They chose this pattern as it is a common one from the 1900s. Having many community members work on the quilt really makes it a special 'community quilt' to honor our 125 years of being the Village of Lafayette and eventually the City of Lafayette.

**STREAMS**: A special STREAMS informational meeting was held prior to the November 13 council meeting. Uma Vempati from Kimley-Horn shared with the council, staff and guests the progress the technical team, which consists of Uma, Al Fox, Michael Looft and Curt Reetz. The STREAMS project is working on the feasibility of developing a regional wastewater facility with the four cities of Winthrop, Lafayette, Gibbon and New Auburn and two industries of Heartland Corn Products and Dairy Farmers of America (DFA), both in Winthrop. The group came together due to the increased State and Federal regulations for the waste flows and what the cost would be individually to meet these new limits. The group has worked to closer define the project into EDUs, which evaluates wastewater characteristics. Normal domestic wastewater is compared to these characteristics and comes up with the EDU number, so all entities are on a more even cost sharing. The technical team continues to define areas that need to be researched further to define the needs more precisely.

#### Council Briefs: 11/13/2024 7:00pm

**Guests:** Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications, Brennan Moldan – Staff, Residents Jessica Moldan – 551 5<sup>th</sup> Street, Logan VanDeest – 631 10<sup>th</sup> Street, Lila Ellis – 731 Lafayette Avenue and JoAnn Portner – 351 8<sup>th</sup> Street.

Public Hearing: Rezone 400 6th Street from Commercial to Residential. All comments in favor, no against – council later approved Ord. 149 to rezone the parcel. Approved: Agenda and Consent Agenda including the 10/14 minutes & bills totaling \$70,001.53, the treasurer's report including the bank reconciliation for October, receipts of \$41,685.43, 2024 payrolls 21, 21 & 22 and 2024-2025 sump pump waivers for Barber, H. Hacker, Hurd, Koval, Krueger, N. Langhoff, S Morson, J Portner, Maidl, Weisensel and Youngblom. Reports: Fox: Submitted report & updates: Wellnitz sign installed, a recirculation valve guit working at the WWTF. Tauber: Positive comments on the Lion drinking fountain. Burger: Submitted report and read the annual statement about the truth in taxation hearings, will meet with Xcel for new franchise agreement, gWorks postponed until January 6. Peterson: RS Fiber cancelled due to no new information Klingler: Council approved the pumper use for Arli-dazzle parade - Miss Lafayette. Updated council on upcoming OSHA standards that would affect the city. Dick: Compeer grant received, two new members working well, two others going through process to be certified.

Unfinished Business: Fox updated council on the progress of all the projects and funding. RO: EPA grant on hold for PFA and State comments from MDH, will meet with SEH to review. Stormwater: Televising and cleaning complete except two lines. There were 50 more connection added, but fell within the budget allowed. Lead Service line Inventory: Completed inventory for all but three unknowns, two galvanized lines need replacing, there is funding available, but an engineer must be hired at a cost of approximately \$20,000, just replacing them could be about \$5,000 to \$6,000. Community Center: Was tabled to discuss further at the budget workshop.

**New Business:** Approved November donations of \$4,141.00, which included \$41 from Fillmeup Bucket and \$100 from Five-Star Towing to the 125<sup>th</sup> celebration and donations to the ambulance in a grant from Compeer for \$4,000. Set a public hearing for 12/9 to certify past due utilities and abatement fee, approved Res. 2024-21 Canvassing the election, approved: the Legion to use the firehall for turkey bingo, Mutual aid agreement, Res. 2024-22 P&R 2-year agreement, approved the allocation of funds for the ARPA funds. Cannabis tabled.

The next meeting will be the 1<sup>st</sup> Truth in taxation hearing and final budget workshop on Tuesday, December 3, and council meeting with public hearing o certify utilities on Monday, December 9, 2024.
