Approved: Agenda and Consent Agenda including the 5/12 minutes, bills totaling \$44,544.46, the receipts totaling \$34,484.90. The treasurer's report including the bank reconciliation for May, the 2025 payrolls 10, 11 & Council 1st half and Resolution 2025-113 June Donations totaling \$71,265; all towards the 125th either sponsoring or donating to the event including; \$500 Happy Tails, \$500 Isenberg Electric, \$225 Mark Dick Construction. Also included the Summer 2025 street closures for the 125th celebration Bike & Car nights and & the Lions Pork chop feed, and the temporary liquor license for the Relief beer & wine sampling event on July 25.

Reports: Fox: submitted his report and highlighted worked with P&R group on an emergency plan, he discussed the park fences; P&R would like to replace both for over \$109,755, not including demo or the other option to repair the first base line of the softball field to reset 24 poles to the appropriate depth Council approved fixing the first base line. Council also approved fixing the 10th street minimum maintenance road. Burger: Reported that the first billing in Munibilling went through, updated council on the 125th, Reed and her attended a county board workshop along with Nicollet and Courtland about registration and compliance of cannabis businesses. Klingler: Asked for council to waive the non-profit fundraiser fee for the current year. Dick: attended Air Ambulance training, all new equipment is installed and personnel trained. The fire hall stairs were built and the new chair lift was used on it for training and it worked great!

Unfinished Business: RO: Waiting on bonding bill. MPCA – update on Sulfate Variance. Stormwater Grant: Fox handed out the Stormwater resiliency Assessment and Action plan for council to review STREAMS: Preliminary engineering request has not been received by Kimly-Horn, MESERB suggested to look to another engineering firm for project management activities, Kimly-Horn is no longer on the project. SEH estimates for the next phase are \$75,000 or \$18,750 per city. New Business: Set a public hearing for the July 14 Council meeting for ZONE 2025-05 Xcel Energy installation of a new substation, replacing poles and reconductoring.

Other: There were no replied of spraying of the city. No action taken. VanDeest inquired about painting by intersections he will connect with Fox.
